
WE LIVE IT OUT

We ensure a financially secure school and a well-maintained facility with appropriate resources for all.




We are accessible to students from all walks of life and embrace children from diverse religious, economic, and ethnic backgrounds.

OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS, THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS BUYING HOT LUNCH HAS DOUBLED FROM 130 to 270 per day.



The needs of our dining hall and nutrition program have completely changed. Because of limited space, our culinary team prepares meals in batches causing our lunch block to begin at 10:45 AM and conclude at 1:20 PM.

- This elongated lunch period disrupts the school schedule.
- Our students are forced to eat earlier or later. not at optimal times.
- The size of our preparation space limits the variety of food we can safely and efficiently store, refrigerate, prepare, cook, and serve.

THE BOTTOM LINE?

This is the single space on our entire campus that each student passes through every day. When our students' health and wellness isn't a top priority, we fall short on our promise to truly nurture the whole child.

By incorporating elements of flexible design—such as partitions—the dining facility can serve multiple purposes all day and all year long—from Aftercare and scouting to band rehearsals, parent association meetings, and baccalaureate exercises.

A FITTING TRIBUTE:

The Sabo Center

ST. BERNARD IS A THRIVING, SUCCESSFUL INDEPENDENT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY.

Over the last 15 years, much of that success is due to our Head of School, Mr. Carl J. (Chuck) Sabo. When Mr. Sabo arrived at SBA in 2006, he stepped in to lead with constant positivity, hard work, bold ideas, plus a dash of fun.

During his tenure, St. Bernard Academy:

- Increased enrollment by 70%, from 225 students in 2006 to 383 students today
- Earned 2017 National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence Award from the U.S. Department of Education
- Completed a \$1.4 million fundraising campaign to add an 18,000 square foot expansion including a new entrance on Bernard Ave, new offices, 7 new classrooms, and a new multipurpose space
- Increased Annual Fund giving from \$25,000 in 2006 to over \$200,000 in 2021
- Re-energized SBA's Athletics, Drama, Music, Reading and Science programs
- Ensured SBA's financial stability by increasing revenues from \$1.3 million in 2006 to just under \$6 million in 2021
- Added two Bus Service routes and a Junior Kindergarten program to add more value for families
- Continues to navigate the challenges of the pandemic, with an emphasis on keeping kids safe and in school

We are proud to honor Mr. Sabo and all that he has done for the school—by naming this proposed new gathering space after him.

After all, this space is much more than just a dining hall. It's a place where students of all ages gather together for a meal. Where parent groups meet and mingle. Where students learn and play outside the classroom. Where we hold our most special events. It's the very center of our SBA community, much like Mr. Sabo himself.

In July 2022, Mr. Sabo will retire as SBA's Head of School. Though his tenure is coming to an end, the Sabo Center will cement his legacy at SBA. By making a gift to the **SPACE FOR GRACE** Campaign in honor of Mr. Sabo, you will be a crucial part of that legacy.
