Plot Summary

Standard: RL.8.2: Provide an objective summary of the text. (No SPOILERS!)

Character Analysis

Standard: RL.8.3: Analyze how particular lines of dialogue or incidents in a story or drama propel the action, reveal aspects of a character, or provoke a decision.

Theme

Standard: RL.8.2: Determine a theme or central idea of a text and analyze its development over the course of the text, including its relationship to the characters, setting, and plot; provide an objective summary of the text.

Point of View

Standard: RL.8.6: Analyze how differences in the points of view of the characters and the audience or reader create such effects as suspense or humor.

Speaking & Listening

Standard: SL.8.4: Present . . . in a focused, coherent manner with pertinent descriptions, facts, well-chosen details, and examples; use appropriate eye contact, adequate volume, and clear pronunciation.

You will be sharing/presenting your project to your literature class during the first week of school. Your project should be brief, between 5 - 7 minutes. It should be well-organized, i.e. *helps audience understand the book*. There should be absolutely NO SPOILERS! The project should be visually pleasing and the information should be presented in an appropriate manner, i.e. eye contact, adequate volume, clear pronunciation.
